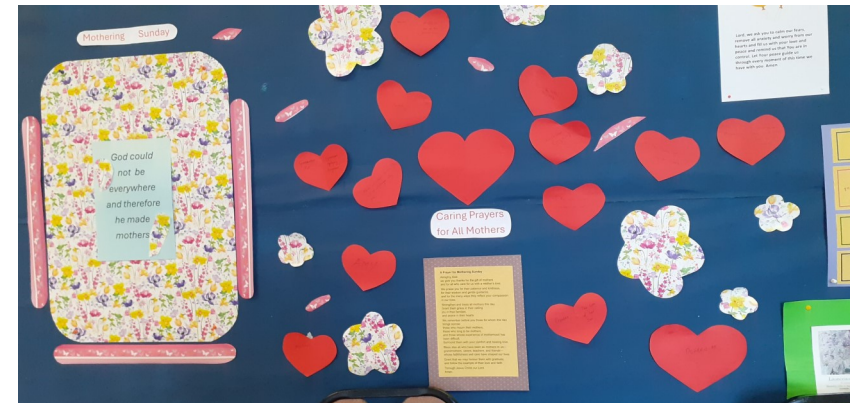


## TREBULLETT METHODIST CHURCH REPORT FOR APRIL

On 15<sup>th</sup> March, Mothering Sunday, we were welcomed to a café style service in Trebulet Hall with tea and coffee. We were also tempted by biscuits from Jan Howell and cupcakes kindly prepared by Jan's neighbour. Mary Tucker opened the service and expertly coordinated the proceedings throughout. Ruth Burden played the piano for one of the hymns, while Janet Honey operated the projector for the others. Mary Tucker had thoughtfully selected some beautiful hymns reflecting on mothers and Mary the mother of Jesus, and her love for her son, Jesus.

Angela Morrison read prayers for mothers and families and led the congregation in the Lord's Prayer. Linda Venning shared the history of Mothering Sunday. Ken and Jane Scoble, Brian Venning and Angela Morrison presented a short sketch based on the parable of the lost sheep, drawing a comparison with a mother's love for her children. Iris Stanbury delivered the Bible reading from Luke 2:41–52.

Mary also read a moving reflection on God creating a woman—describing her strength and resilience, yet also her deep capacity for love. It explained that a tear running down her cheek was not a flaw, but rather an overflow of many emotions, including joy, sorrow, frustration, and happiness.



Towards the end of the service, everyone was given the opportunity to remember a mother by writing her name on a red heart, along with the reason for remembering her if they wished. These hearts were then attached to the notice board, while spare ones were left on the table for visitors who might also wish to add a name.

Neil Burden then led the prayers of intercession. The service concluded with a reminder that today is a day centred on love.

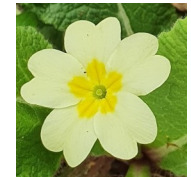
A couple of garden activities for Spring;

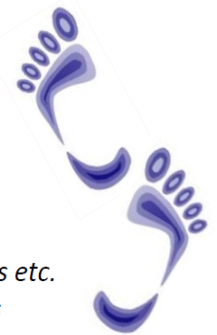

### Coralie Davies 1946 to 2026

Coralie moved from Surrey to Tressell Farm, Rezare, along with her husband, Philip and sister Ruth in 2014. Having been a parochial church councillor and a member of the local WI in Surrey, Coralie was keen to embrace life in the parish of Lezant, attending St Briochus regularly and joining Lezant WI. After a few years enjoying the beautiful local countryside, venturing further afield to the beaches, unfortunately as a consequence of diabetes, Coralie developed kidney disease. This inevitably finally resulted in the requirement for dialysis, necessitating 4 hourly sessions, three times a week at the unit in Holsworthy. Cheerfully Coralie loved the wonderful drives through the countryside during the changing seasons. However Coralie also continued to enjoy as much social life as possible, especially the church coffee mornings.

It is a tribute to Coralie's popularity that so many people attended her burial at Pentiddy Natural Burials and afterwards to celebrate her life at Tressell Farm.

The Reverend Canon Olive Stevens gave a beautiful service at the burial whilst Coralie's longtime friend, Carolyn Deakins read a moving tribute to Coralie whom she had known since they both started at Sir William Perkins's grammar school for girls when they were 11. In it Carolyn described Coralie's generosity of spirit, her deep love of knowledge and literature, her erudition, her wide ranging interests, and the self-effacing and very brave way in which she faced the challenges of her life and her illness.

## In our Garden - The Painted Lady

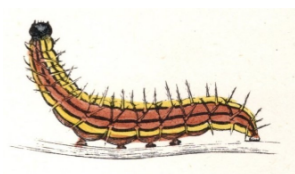


The Painted lady is one of the British Aristocratic Butterflies, the largest and most attractive butterflies! They include the Red Admiral, the Purple Emperor, the Peacock and the Camberwell Beauty.



With fritillaries they are known as NYMPHALIDS. They have short front legs held forward near the head and thus often appear to have only 4 legs. Most of the Aristocratic butterflies hibernate in this country but traditionally (and certainly before climate change started), Painted Ladies could not survive the winter temperatures and damp of the British Isles, so they were migratory like swallows and chiffchaffs.

Although they are not common here, the Painted Lady is the world's most widely distributed butterfly, inhabiting all continents other than Australia and the Antarctic. They tend to live in warmer climates, but the Painted Ladies we have here, sipping the nectar of the thistle flower, its favourite food, have migrated from North



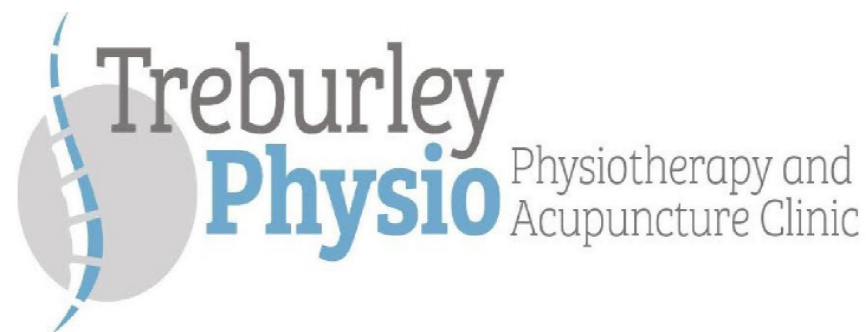
Africa, particularly Morocco. They fly at only 6 to 12 feet above the ground and can cover up to 100 miles each day. It is said they can fly up to 30mph.

Once here they lay eggs and have the usual life cycle through caterpillar, chrysalis and mature butterfly but in the British Isles those born here perish in the winter.

Such a frail beautiful creature flies up to 600 miles only to die here; even their caterpillars are different from most – they actually construct tents of silk, usually on thistle plants.

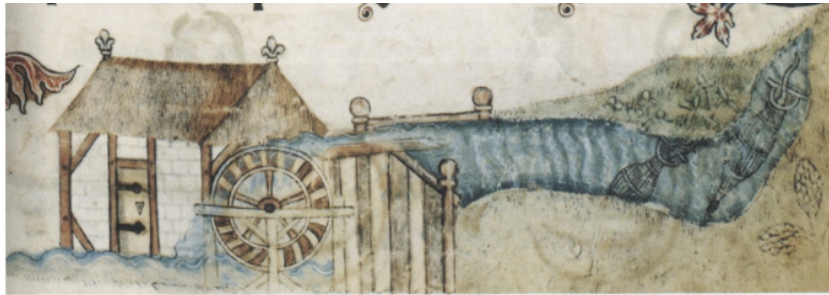
After a search of over 200 mills in the Westcountry, my late father persuaded the Jaspers to sell both the Tre-carrell Mill and Dobbins Cott (Dauben's Cott) but completing the paperwork took several years, involving both the Canadian and New Zealand High Commission as members of the Jasper family had emigrated. My father's intention to set up a modern dairy farm and produce his own electricity wasn't easy and not helped by the 'Men from the Ministry' who were only prepared to authorise the purchase of enough steel to build 'half a waterwheel' and the Launceston District Council who said "*the kind of people who would want to live at Tre-carrell Mill, wouldn't need electricity!*" Despite this and other setbacks, he rebuilt the mill and generated electricity for the next thirty years, even through the winter of 1963 when the waterwheel froze solid.

It was in this same year that bureaucracy started to plague mill owners in the form of the *Water Resources Act 1963*. This Act challenged the centuries old right of water mills to use water. They even offered to bulldoze in the leat to the mill, not appreciating that watermills don't 'consume' the water, which is returned downstream of the mill, and without the mill we would have no electricity or heating. Thus began a personal battle to save the few remaining mills in Britain that has lasted over fifty years and continues today with even greater ferocity. Millstreams are not only a means of producing clean electricity, they are a vital nursery area for fish, eels and once again beavers. Instead of valuing the 'wetlands' created by leats, the official line is that all leats should be waterproofed, with concrete, if necessary, even if it destroys the adjoining wetlands. Twelve years of *Litigation* in the High Court to save Tre-carrell Mill that has been in operation for over 700 years and was one of the first to feed 'green electricity' into the National Grid, is *'Just grist to the mill'* I suppose!

*"Grist to the mill"*

The year is 1331, Geoffrey Chaucer was still but a glint in his father John's eye as he quaffs a glass of his latest imported vintage. The ink is drying on a *Deed* written in Latin concerning one Robert Honychurch, chaplain and *deforciant* of Trecarrell Mill. This cleric, in possession of 1 messuage, 2 mills, 1 ploughland, 5 acres of wood, worth 24 shillings rent in *Trecarl* is being summoned before the Justices to answer a *Plea of Covenant* by Henry de Trecarl and his wife Sarah that the mills and land will revert to their son Giles and his wife Elizabeth Trecarl upon their death. We must move on quickly because the *'Black Death'*, that will kill over a third of the population, is fast approaching. We now read that, in 1547, a John Axforth, glover of Lezant living at Trecarrell Mill, has been arrested in Menheniot by Sheriff John Trelawney, being suspected of a *Felony* and the *'Destruction of a watermill'*. One wonders if this was sabotage of a competing mill or a dispute closer to home as Trecarrell Mill was then engaged in fulling and tanning, a very smelly old business!



Fast forward to 1644 and King Charles is a guest of local MP Ambrose Manaton at nearby Trecarrell Manor along with his 10,000 strong *King's Army of the West*, en route to Liskeard and the battle at Lostwithiel. The army would no doubt have got their supplies of flour as they marched past the watermill of Richard Sargent, a distant ancestor of my wife Alice who paid the *Hearth Tax* for Trecarrell Myll in 1664. It appears that Richard was truly significant in the parish, with descendants becoming tenants of both Bottonnett and Trecarrell Manor, before becoming the owners. The Sargents married into many of the local families that are still living in the area three hundred years later.

Then in 1697 there is another *Deed* this time between Henry Manaton and Thomas Fitze a tanner of Lezant who is buying his way into the various properties after the era of the Axwards (Axworthy). The Fitzes, meantime, were only thwarted in their ambitions by the enterprising John Husband who in 1718, according to another *Deed* had started his campaign to take over the *World* or possibly just Lezant, for over the next century or so various John Husbands acquired leases and properties, investing in *The Great Western Ochre & Color Works Limited* at Trecarrell Mill and gifting land to the chapel in Trebulet. The Ochre, mined at Higher Larrick and across the river Inny near Halwell, was brought to the ochre works at Trecarrell Mill, where it was ground up and dried for use in paint manufacture. Started in 1888 the business wasn't a success and closed shortly after the first World War. As children we used to play in the old buildings before they were demolished in the mid 1950s.

### **PARISH TAXI SCHEME—FOR RESIDENTS OF LEZANT PARISH ONLY**

If you are a resident of Lezant Parish, you can claim a subsidy for any taxi journey using Launceston Taxis. (Please note: the taxi cannot be used on a regular basis for commuting between home and work, nor as a school-run vehicle.)

From 01 December 2024 the subsidy was increased to £7 per single journey (you can also claim £7 for the return journey, if applicable). Please note this increase will be for a limited time only in order to use up reserves - once the grant is exhausted the subsidy will be lowered. Please check the magazine for any updates or contact the clerk. To take advantage of the scheme the taxi must be pre-booked through Launceston Taxis on 07340 813434. The taxi driver will have a form that he will complete. You sign the form and pay the reduced rate to the driver. Please note that the single fares quoted below are for guidance only, and may differ depending on where you are being picked up/ dropped off:
